The Good News

Emergencies at compressor stations are incredibly rare! Our sites are staffed 24/7 and the system is continuously monitored at a central location. If something isn't right, state-of-the-art safety equipment automatically protects our system, people and communities.

Controlled flames (flaring) at the top of a stack is normal, but generally you should not see, hear or smell the daily operations at a compressor station. We do our best to let you know if we will be doing work that may be more noticeable and concerning to you.

Potential Concerns

Hear:

Loud, abnormal sounds such as hissing, loud bang/boom or blowing that sounds like a jet engine.

Smell:

Rotten egg odor, which is added to natural gas to help identify leaks.

See:

- Large, growing flames not coming from the top of a vent stack.
- Unauthorized or suspicious person(s) on the site, which may include someone trying to enter through a location other than a gate, not wearing Consumers Energy protective equipment or clothing, carrying weapons or behaviors like hiding or yelling.
